## From The Rabbi's

Hello, this is your Rabbi speaking! At our last synagogue Board of Directors meeting, Gene Bagoon suggested, upon request for a good opening line, that this could be the start for this month's column. As we've thought about it further, it led us to reflect on the tremendous privilege we feel to be "your Rab-bis." It is without a doubt a tremendous position, to be invited to share in your lives and the life of our community in a very special way.

By the end of May, we will complete our seventh year serving Congregation Beth Shalom. Each of us will be celebrating, individually, twenty years or more in the rabbinate. While ongoing study and reflection are part of our lives, the demands of syna-gogue life also make it difficult to go as deeply into our texts and practices as you might wish your Rab-bis would do in order to bring fresh insight and en-ergy to the learning and tasks at hand. Thus, as part of the arrangement with the congregation, we have built in a three month sabbatical opportunity, and want to let you know in advance of the plans.

The sabbatical is Biblically based, as the Sab-bath year every seven years was instituted, to allow the fields to rest and to regenerate the nutrients that feed the growing plants. Scholars and other profes-sionals have found these periods of stepping back in order to look at their field from new perspectives to be very helpful, and so too, rabbinic scholarship de-pends in part upon this practice.

We have scheduled the sabbatical to be as minimally intrusive on the life of Congregation Beth Shalom as possible, and so it will begin after religious school and confirmation are completed for the year and will conclude in August before the first B'nai Mitzvah and the High Holy Days. Our time will be spent in Israel, primarily in Jerusalem, giving us a chance to immerse ourselves in the language of eve-ryday Hebrew as well as the Hebrew of Biblical and

Rabbinic texts.

There are learning op-portunities on every corner of Jerusalem and in every shop, and at the same time there are spe-cial study sessions we'll be taking advantage of, the main one being the rabbinic semi-nar at the Shalom Hartman Institute. This is a world renowned center and each summer one hundred rabbis study intensively with some of the leading scholars in Israel, as well as engaging in ses-sions with leading political and military figures. We'll also be learning classical texts and having the chance to become more familiar with a variety of worship styles and practices.



We are grateful for the gift you give us to be called your Rabbis, and for the chance to bring more of ourselves and more of Judaism and of our people's history and traditions to you in the years to come. Thank you in advance for your support and understanding.
